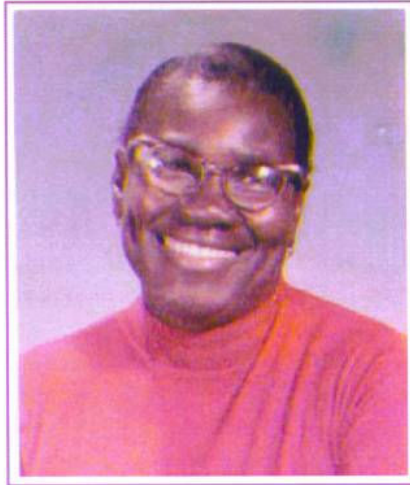

Sunrise: October 13, 1921

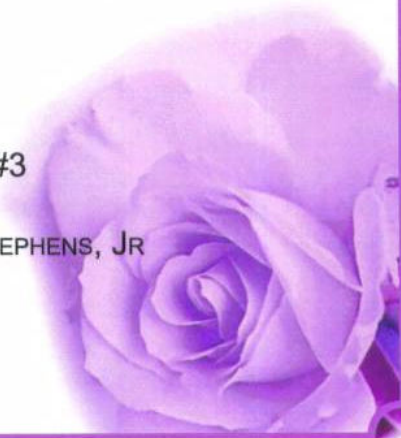

Eulogy

Bianca Oliver Cornwall, known to everyone as Ms. B, was born on October 13, 1921, on the island of St. Croix, where she also did her schooling.

Ms. B. moved to St. Thomas at the young age of 21, where she stayed with family and friends until she moved on her own. She then started her family and gave birth to seven children: Terrence, Noreen, Marvin, Doreen, Berris, Lorna and Ludence. She started her first employment at a laundry located in Subbase where the navy ships came in and they washed and ironed their clothes. From there she worked at several hotels, until she got a Government job working for the Department of Education at the Addelita Cancryn Jr. High School as a custodian worker until her retirement. Even though she retired she didn't stop there, she had her breakfast club serving pate, johnny cake, tunafish sandwich, cheese sandwich and bush tea for the faculty and staff at Cancryn School. She also did the opening and closing of the classrooms at night for the Adult Education classes.

Ms. B was also an active member of the Frederick Lutheran Church. She attended Service every Sunday unless she was sick. She took part in everything and anything the church had.

When you talk about Ms. B., she had a love for baseball. Rainfall or sunshine, we couldn't stop her from going to Griffth Park. Ms. B would throw her jacket over her shoulder and her umbrella in her hand and up the waterfront she went. She sat on the bleachers and cheered her team on. At the opening of the league she would cut the ribbon or throw out the first ball, and at the end of the league she would get a T-shirt and a trophy. She was a true fan.

But as time went by she started to get down, but still strong in her mouth. Anything you said to her she always had an answer to give back. Friends would pass by to see her and they would say, "Ms. B you remember my name?" She would say, "Yes, pudding and tail, if you asked me tomorrow I will tell you the same." Then she took sick, even on her hospital bed her mouth was strong, strong until the end. She was here but now she's gone. Gone but not forgotten. Rest in Peace, Ms. B until we meet again.

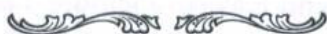
