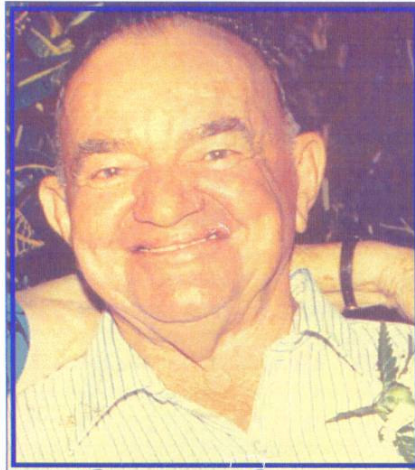

He was the youngest of four children and the only son. At the tender age of one, Edward's family traveled to St. Thomas by boat in search of better opportunities.

Edward attended school until the 6th grade and like many others, discontinued school to help out his family. On February 12, 1939, Edward married his wife of 65 years, Gertrude Magras. As a past time, Eddy, enjoyed a good game of cards or dominos with the boys and watching those boat races which spanned from Frenchtown to Flamboyant Hotel to Brewers Beach.

His grand children and great-grandchildren played a vital role in his daily life as they spent many after school hours and summers with him and Gertrude. He spoiled each one of them with his love and adoration. He involved them in his affection for the ocean on many fishing excursions and weekend trips to Water Island, the making of his fish traps, cooking, and his many old time stories and tales.

Things became more difficult after his wife slowly lost her eye sight. As she became more dependent on him, he took on some of her daily tasks and became her eyes. He even curtailed those weekend fishing trips just to be by her side. His sons continued the weekend outings for as long as they could, for they knew he enjoyed the sight of a "good catch".

Within the past ten years his health started to deteriorate. However, his sense of humor was untouched, as he always had a smart remark to share. Although this past year was his most trying time, Edward always believed in the Lord, held his own, and always had a smile☺.
