## *Emelda Ann Berry Querrard*

Emelda worked in town for many years first at C.M. Caron, then at Continental and finally AH Riise. Although these were her daytime jobs, her work did not end there. When she came home in the evening she worked side by side with her husband Larry in his area of expertise, building houses. Once old enough, even Larry Jr. would help out with the building.

Emelda was well known for her love of listening and dancing merengue music. She also had a passion for planting fruit trees, vegetables and of course, her flowers. She would always be picking flower seeds no matter where she went. She loved planting so much that she moved to the middle of the mountains in Utuado, Puerto Rico where she lived for the last 7 years with her companion Confesor Soto until the day of her death. But there was no question that her biggest passion in life were her three grandchildren. When Millie was on St. Thomas you would never see her without one of her grandchildren and usually the other two weren't far behind. She always had a beautiful smile and a heart of gold.
