Eugene H. Olive

June 11, 1923 - June 24, 1994

Eugene H. Olive, popularly known as "Gene" to his family and friends, was born here on St. Thomas on June 11, 1923. He was one of thirteen children born to Frederick and Emilie Olive of St. Thomas. He received his formal education at the Sts. Peter and Paul School here on St. Thomas. Forty-three years ago he married Irma Olive and from that union two beautiful twins, Patricia and Theresa came forth. Late in 1944, or about the time that the Allied Forces were making their assault on Omaha Beach in France, Gene was drafted into the U.S. Army. He served in the U.S. Army's Medical Corps where he performed with distinction and was honorably discharged two years later, as World War II came to a close. Upon returning home Gene married his sweetheart Irma and moved to New York City where he launched his hospitality career with the New York Sheraton Hotel, and after a few years with the Sheraton he returned to St. Thomas to work at the Virgin Islands Hilton Hotel and from there to Quetel's Grocery, Normandie Bar, Chateau Blanc, Victory Bar and part time at WSTA.

Anyone who lived in Frenchtown or came to Frenchtown for social or political reasons had to come in contact with Gene Olive. You were convinced after speaking to Gene, that he knew where the political winds were blowing, and as such, his advice was valuable. I listened to him when I ran four times for the Legislature and led all contestants in the Frenchtown polling station. Both Gene and Irma were centers of influence here in Frenchtown. Gene Olive was a staunch New York Mets fan who gloried in their championships and took their bad years in stride knowing that they would make a comeback. He was a member of FTCO Softball Team.

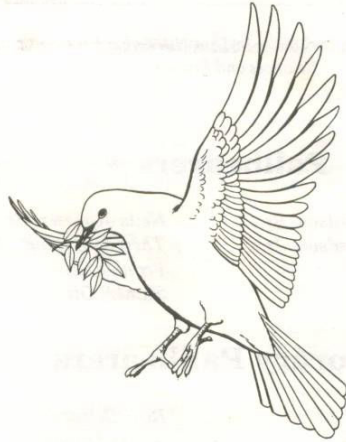
