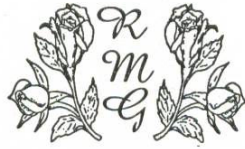

Eulogy

Joseph Theodore Turbe was born on January 30th 1924 to the late Arlene Moron Turbe and Pierre Turbe of Caraneige. He was the third of eight children. "Joe" or "The Butcher" as he was affectionately known, attended the St. Peter and Paul Catholic school. He later worked with his father Pierre also known as "White Pierre" in the family business; The Meat Stall. During those early days Pierre and his two sons Joe and Beal operated one of the few meat stalls which provided the entire St. Thomas Community with fresh meat before there were such large chain stores as Grand Union or Pueblo.

Realizing that refrigeration machinery was quite limited Joe mastered the art of slaughtering livestock and preserving the meat, a skill which he taught to many others. As a result the Virgin Island families enjoyed the deli of corned beef, pork and fish.

Upon the passing of his father, Joe assumed the management of the business and later relocated to Frenchtown and opened Joe's Meat Market. Joe travelled extensively throughout the British Virgin Islands obtaining and transporting livestock for the business. It was during one of those many voyages that he met the former Lestelle Callwood fell in love and was married. Out of the Union four children were born, Pierre (deceased), Marie, Lorraine and Patricia. He also had two other children Denise and Angeli.

Joseph Theodore Turbe was a devout catholic. He attended the St. Ann Chapel and the St. Peter and Paul Cathedral until he took ill on September 19th 1995 at the age of 71 Joseph was called home to be with his lord and saviour. He shall and will be missed.
