Pierre Emile Cerge was born on the island of St. Barthelemy, F.W.I., on February 6, 1920 and arrived in St. Thomas on January 6, 1924 with his sister, Annicia, and their parents, Mr. & Mrs. Charles Hyppolite Cerge.

He attended Sts. Peter and Paul School and later worked at various jobs in the construction field. He became a U.S. citizen and was drafted into the Army during World War Two. After serving in the Army, he lived and worked in New York City for a few years before returning home in the early 1950's.
