As a young woman of age 18, she met married Pablo Reyes from the Philippines, while he was assigned to the U.S. Navy. Their union produced eight children. Angelina, Clarita, Patricia, Paula(deceased), Gladys, Pablo, Maggie and Agnes.

A faithful devoted wife and mother, many years was spent alone caring and raising their children until her husbands retirement from the Navy in 1945.
